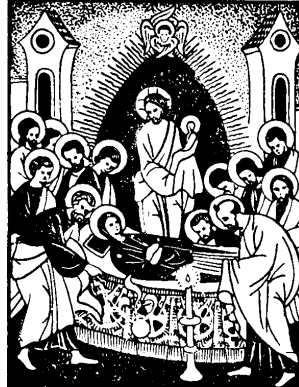

**TODAY'S FEAST: The Translation of the Relics of Holy Wonderworkers Cyrus and John the Unmercenary Healers.** They were known as unmercenarys because they charged no fee for their services. Cyrus was a physician in Alexandria, Egypt. He healed through medicine as well as prayer. He urged people to cleanse their souls from sin, as he had discovered that sin many times caused illness. When the final and most brutal persecution of Christians began under the Emperor Diocletian, the Patriarch of Alexandria, Apollinarios, warned Cyrus to flee. He went to Arabia and became a monk. Cyrus was sought after there as well, and so John went to Arabia to see him. He also became a monk, and the two men healed together. When the two heard of a Christian woman and her three daughters being tortured in Kanopos, a village near Alexandria, they went to see if they could possibly be of help. Their attempt was in vain. Cyrus and John, as well as the family, were martyred. After they were tried and executed, their relics were hidden in the church of St.Mark. Later, when Patriarch Cyril of Alexandria prayed for the demise of the temple of idols in Menuthis, an angel of God appeared. He told Cyril to transfer the relics there. He housed the relics in a large cathedral that had once been the site of the huge pagan's temple. Miracle hearings of blindness, poison, and other diseases took place there. The saints' remains are partially in Menuth, Egypt as well as in Rome. Miracle hearings have occurred at both those sites from their prayers. They are called upon for sleeplessness as well.
