

who tried to force them to adopt the Roman Catholic faith. The Aleuts would not submit saying. Their captors left them two to a cell for the remainder of the day to think it over. In the evening, they came to their cells and took one of their number named Peter. He was tortured gruesomely to his death while the others were forced to watch, but he refused to submit. The following day, an order came that the rest of the thirteen prisoners were to be taken to Monterey to be detained there. One of them eventually escaped to tell the story of Peter's martyrdom. Peter died a martyr's death for Holy Orthodoxy and was the first native born American to be canonized.

TODAY'S FEAST: Priest-Monk Juvenaly was among those early missionaries in Alaska who preached the Orthodox faith to the native Americans (Eskimos) there. In 1795 he left Kodiak island to go to Nuchek where he successfully baptized more than seven hundred of the Chugach people there. He then crossed the Kenai Bay and baptized all the local inhabitants there. In 1796 he crossed to Alaska going towards Lake Iliamna. Though he had brought many converts into the faith, resentment began to build when he forced the male converts to forsake the practice of polygamy. He also persuaded the native chiefs and other leading men of the islands to send their children to Kodiak for a superior education than was possible on those remote islands. After he left with the children, the men regretted letting their children go and gave chase. When they caught up with him, they attacked and murdered him. Though he had a firearm with him, St. Juvenaly did not try to flee and offered no resistance to his attackers asking only that those who were with him be spared. He is commemorated on September 24 as a New Martyr of America.

St. Peter the Aleut was an Aleut Eskimo who had converted to Orthodoxy. He and thirteen other Aleut Christians were taken captive by Spaniards in California
